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

Need to know

- **Airports:** Miami International Airport (MIA) is the main hub, but Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood Airport (FLL) is just a 30-minute drive away.
- **Transportation:** If you can, walk or rent a scooter or bike to cruise the neighborhoods like a local. Hop on the free trolleys or Metromover to explore downtown. Rideshares are available when needed.
- **Best time to visit:** December thru May hits the sweet spot in this tropical locale. Temperatures are great year-round, but summer can be muggy, and early fall can be stormy. Pay attention to Miami's event schedule, too — Art Basel in early December means great vibes paired with high prices and big crowds.
- **Ideal length of stay:** Miami is made for long weekends. You can soak up a lot of vibes and sunshine in three or four days.
- **Signature dishes:** Stone crab (seasonal delicacies with mustard sauce), ceviche, classic Cuban sandwiches, fresh seafood, and key lime pie. Don't miss a round of Miami's classic tropical cocktails or mocktails.
- **What to wear:** It's Miami — go glam if you can. The city is hot, so pack breezy, summery outfits, swimsuits, sun hats and chic-but-comfy footwear. Anything goes, so don't be afraid to make a statement.

History and culture

Miami's history is deeply intertwined with its location as a gateway to the Americas. Once a tiny settlement along the Miami River, it took generations to blossom into the metropolis — and tourist hotspot — of today. The first significant wave of Cuban exiles arrived around 1959, sparking Miami's modern identity as a hub for Cuban-American culture. Now, Latin, Caribbean and American influences all blend into a colorful fusion of art, music and food.

Speaking of food, Miami's culinary scene is thriving. Many kitchens are rooted in Cuban staples but enhanced by Peruvian ceviche, Haitian griot and fresh seafood. The city's tropical climate offers a parade of fresh flavors, from seasonal seafood to juicy mangoes and guavas.

Miami is also a feast for the eyes. Landmarks like Vizcaya Museum and Gardens are studies in historical elegance, while Miami Beach's Art Deco architecture is an iconic depiction of 20th-century American glam and jazz. Simply put: Miami is a celebration of culture and connection — an unforgettable place for first-time visitors.

Activities



Art: Stroll through Wynwood, Miami's artsy hub with bold street murals, trendy bars and eclectic galleries. Don't miss the iconic street art museum Wynwood Walls.

Shopping: Find high-end fashion at the Design District's boutiques and cafés. Bal Harbour Shops also offers breezy open-air shopping.

Lounging: Vibes are chic and sophisticated at 1 Hotel South Beach's rooftop pool, which boasts ocean views. There's also the sandy beach south of Fifth for a quiet break from the masses. Many hotels have private beachfronts, too.

Culture: Escape the heat or rain at the Perez Art Museum, Vizcaya Museum and Gardens or the Institute of Contemporary Art.

Food: Eating your way through Miami could take months. Start off with institutions like Joe's Stone Crab or La Sandwicherie Miami Beach followed by Michelin-Starred Korean steakhouse COTE Miami or The Surf Club. Don't miss Carbone, an Italian-American eatery full of retro glamour.

Tours: Reserve your spot on a Miami food tour or a sunset boat cruise where you can view Miami's stunning skyline from a new perspective.

Nightlife: Miami's nightlife mainstays include the jazzy Faena Theater, 24/7 ultraclub E11EVEN Miami, award-winning cocktail bar Broken Shaker and celebrity-spotting hotspot LIV Fontainebleau Miami Beach.

Nature: Longer vacations warrant visiting Everglades National Park, a sprawling wetland less than an hour away. Spot alligators on an airboat or kayak through peaceful mangroves.

Florida Keys (3.5 hours by car): Leave Miami's glitz for a tropical paradise offering crystal-clear waters, snorkeling and laid-back island vibes. Visit Key West for quirky charm or Key Largo for postcard-perfect snorkeling.

Bahamas (45-minute flight or 2 hours by ferry): Hemingway's beloved escape is just a high-speed ferry or plane ride away, so why not spend a few days splashing in crystal-clear water and soaking up vibrant international island culture? Don't forget to pack your passport.
